THE LOUISIANA MURAL ORGANIZATION

The Louisiana Mural Organization, Inc. was the idea of a Louisiana resident and his wife, joined by others from the community, and it was incorporated in 2000. In addition to bringing the art form to the community, it has also assisted in the revitalization of the downtown area. Donations for this project were made by local businesses, residents and organizations.

The organization's objectives are to "promote the painting of murals, which reflect the history, culture, surrounding area or people of the community, on bare walls of buildings in Louisiana, Missouri." To date 24 murals have been created. They have been painted by all levels of artists, from professional mural painters to high school student class projects. Some artists have completed more than one. The subject matter ranges from steamboats to important figures in history.

For the most part they are located in the historic downtown business district but several are in out lying areas of the community. They can all be easily located using the map featured in this brochure. Please enjoy our murals and our community.



The City of Louisiana, Missouri, population approximately 3,300, is located on the Rt. 79 Scenic Byway along the Mississippi River about 90 miles north of St. Louis and 30 miles south of Hannibal.






